Twenty Five Years of the Millenium Green



When Rosemary Rigby discovered that the field next to her house was for sale she decided she would buy it. Her cousin, Geoffrey, came from Northamptonshire to bid on her behalf at the auction which took place at the Black Swan in Much Dewchurch on 8th November 1978. She was delighted to get a phone call from Geoffrey telling her "It's yours! It's yours!"

In 1996 the late Queen Elizabeth appealed for 250 Millenium Greens to be created throughout the land for the benefit of local communities. Once again, the redoubtable Miss Rigby did not hesitate. "I decided to give my very precious little field away," she said. It became a Millenium

Green on 1st January 2000, an occasion marked by local people with the planting of an English Oak at 11am at top of the Green followed by a celebration with mince pies and sherry. It is the only Millenium Green in South Herefordshire. "It remains safe for 1000 plus years for the people of Wormelow, Much Dewchurch, Much Birch and Llanwarne," explained Rosemary who has been caring for the Green and welcoming people to events there throughout the last 25 years, including the annual Remembrance Service, which this year is on Friday 8th November at 10.30am, led by Revd Mark. Children from Much Birch School will be there, taking a very active part in the service. Everyone is welcome.

The Millenium Green is of course next door to the Violette Zsabo Museum, founded and run by Rosemary Rigby to celebrate the life and bravery of this hero of the Second World War who was awarded the George Cross posthumously. This fascinating collection tells the story of Violette and attracts visitors from all over the world throughout the year as well on the Summer Open Day.

A group of racehorse owners named their horse Violette Zsabo in homage to the war hero. The horse had her first win at Beverley just days before the owners brought her to the celebration of what would have been Violette Zsabo's 100th birthday, June 21st, honoured with an RAF fly past.

Jobs for the Garden in October

This year's weather certainly had an adverse effect on the King's Thorn & Little Birch Gardening Club horticultural show with low numbers of vegetable entries much of which were also of poor quality. The flowers turned out reasonably well despite periods of torrential rain in the days leading up to the show. The one thing I noticed which is not affected by the weather was the low number of domestic entries – surely the art of baking and jam making isn't a thing of the past. Well done to Lesley and the Gardening Club Committee and congratulations to all the trophy winners.

Jobs to Do

- *Remove saucers from under outside pots and containers, raise them off the ground onto 'pot feet' or battens to maintain good drainage.
- *Check that greenhouse heaters are in working order.
- *Lift and divide large clumps of perennials.
- *Lift and store dahlia tubers.
- *Mist house plants.
- *Collect up leaves of roses affected by blackspot and burn, if you are able, or put in your garden waste bin.
- *Remove larger figs which are unlikely to ripen leaving only pea sized fruit. Protect from frost to ripen next year.
- *Keep harvesting apples, pears and grapes.
- *In sheltered plots sow broad beans at end of the month.
- *They must be hardy eg The Sutton or Aquadulce.
- *Plant garlic.
- *Plant out Spring cabbage.
- *Clear away and compost all spent vegetable foliage eg. runner bean vines, and also clear weeds. Loosen any compacted areas of soil with a fork and ideally sow a green manure crop on areas of bare soil.
- *Continue to feed birds and provide fresh water.
- *Chop up windfall apples and pears. Place on bird tables
- *Remove fruit nets. If you have a fruit cage, remove the 'roof' net just in case we have snow.
- *Remove fallen leaves from ponds to prevent the buildup of too much decaying organic material in the water.
- *Clean out and re-hang nesting boxes.



Nine tips for Safer Fireworks from RoSPA

- 1. Keep fireworks in a closed box and use one at a time.
- 2.Read and follow the instructions on each firework using a torch if necessary.
- 3.Light the firework at arm's length with a taper and stand well back.
- 4. Keep flames and cigarettes, away from fireworks.
- 5. Never return to a firework once it has been lit.
- 6.Don't put fireworks in pockets and never throw them.
- 7. Direct any rocket fireworks well away from spectators.
- 8. Never use paraffin or petrol on a bonfire.
- 9. Make sure the fire is out and surroundings are safe before leaving.
